


Omission

Putting biblical knowledge into practice is the key that teaches truth and the power of God, which in turn changes hearts and lives. (John 8:31-32). - Mentorship Study Approach This was developed as a mentorship study approach. Please contact us
 if you struggle to find a mentor that is equipped to support you on your journey with this series. We host many online sessions
 and are eager to support you on your journey.
- Pray Always pray when you participate in this series so that you invite God through his Holy Spirit to open your mind and heart
- Read the Scriptures It is essential for you to use the Bible to read the scriptures before answering the questions (Rom 10:17)
- Your Opinion doesn't count Always find the answer from the Bible, although you might think you know the answer. You
 are responsible for protecting yourself from false teachings and religious opinions, so take good care.
- Scripture's Answer Count Complete all the answers in the booklet based on the actual Scripture. Usually, the answers
 are simple, but often the challenge is putting it into practice.
- Be Vulnerable Be very honest with yourself, even if it hurts. The saying "no pain, no gain" is relevant in this context.
- Memory Verse Always have a memory verse you are working on. This helps our minds to focus on God and his will.
- Share Share your journey with a friend, and never be discouraged. God loves us, and his patients endure forever.





What does the house represent?



We are all promised trouble in life, both believers and unbelievers.










What is the meaning of "the great crash"?

Is the rock only Jesus? Is there anything more? (See verse 24)
Drawing Instructions:
On the rock, add a Cross to represent Jesus and plus signs that represent
"Putting into practice."
(Students will add a cross symbol on the rock to represent Jesus, and plus signs around it to symbolize actions taken in obedience.)
Heart questions: ♥ Do you believe all Scripture is God-inspired?
Reflect on how your view of Scripture impacts your daily life. Believing that all Scripture is inspired by God means valuing the Bible as authoritative and trustworthy for guidance and decision-making.
Are you willing to hear (read your Bible) and put it into practice (obey)?
Consider your daily habits and commitment to living out what you learn in Scripture.
Are there areas in your life where you know what the Bible says, but you struggle to act on it? What specific practices can you commit to putting into action this week?
Set a personal goal to apply a particular teaching from Jesus in a practical way, whether it's loving your neighbour, forgiving someone, or trusting God in a difficult







Drawing Instructions:


Write the <u>heading</u> for the lesson as "Joh 12:47-48 - WORD OF LIFE"

Draw a large open book with a big cross in the <u>bottom center of the page.</u>

On the <u>left page</u>, write "Jesus Christ," and on the <u>right page</u>, write "Word."

Read the following verses and answer the questions below:

Joh 1:1-3 In the beginning was the Word, and was.....read all. 1Jn 1:1-3 What was from the beginning, what we have.....read all.









QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS: Who is the "Word of life"?
Where can we find the "Word of life"?
How was the creation made? (Hint: Genesis 1)
Why were the disciples sure about Jesus's existence?
Why is it important to learn who Jesus is?
HEART QUESTIONS: Are you willing to follow somebody's teaching without knowing him?
(This question encourages reflection on the importance of having a personal understanding of Jesus and not just following teachings blindly.)
♥ How are you going to learn who Jesus is?
(Possible answers include reading the Bible regularly, studying Jesus' life, praying for insight, and participating in Bible studies.)
♥ Do you have your own Bible?

(Encourage students to get a Bible if they don't have one, so they can engage personally with God's Word.)





Judgement

Visualize Word Judgement

To the <u>left of the cross</u> on the book write "Word", draw an "X" to represent "Rejection" and a skull to symbolize "Condemnation".

To <u>the right of the cross</u>, draw a "√" to represent "Acceptance" and a flame to symbolize "Eternal life".

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS: Why did Jesus come into the world?
How important are Jesus' words?
Would it be fair if we don't know how God is going to judge us?
How is God going to judge us?
How many words should we reject to be condemned by God?
♥ Do you know your Bible?
(Reflect on whether you are familiar with the teachings of Jesus and how well you understand the Word.)
Are you attentive to "how" and "what" Jesus is saying? Why is this important?
(Being attentive is crucial because Jesus' teachings guide us toward life and away from condemnation. It affects our daily decisions and spiritual growth.)
Are you willing to accept all the words of the Bible, even if it hurts?

(Consider the cost of following Jesus and whether you are open to being challenged and changed by His Word.)







MY JOURNEY


Over three decades ago, a man walked into my life, carrying a Bible in his hand. At that point, traditional church services didn't quite reach my heart. There were just too many issues within the church for me to take them seriously. Some of our pastors were living immoral lives, with some struggling with drinking problems, and others involved in disturbing activities. What's more, there was this awful segregation where black people were not allowed to attend the white Sunday services.

Before this encounter, I had been on a quest to find the true meaning of life. I explored it through intellectual conversations, dabbled in politics, and even delved into various religious beliefs. I indulged myself in worldly pleasures, seeking escape from reality through fun, drinking, and the pursuit of wealth. However, none of these pursuits seemed to satisfy the deep yearnings within me.

But everything changed when I found myself standing in front of God's Word, as if I were gazing into a mirror. It was a moment of profound transformation. As I stared at my reflection in that metaphorical mirror, I saw a shattered image of myself, utterly exposed before the all-powerful God.





Drawing Instructions:

From left to right, draw a sequence of images:

- A book to represent God's Word "Scripture".
- To the right of the book, draw wind to represent "God's breathed" or the "by inspiration of God."
- Next, draw four vertical cells to symbolize the practical usefulness of the Scriptures.

On the far right, draw yourself to represent your availability and readiness to do "Good work."

The usefulness of the Word (2 Timothy 3:16-17)

Drawing Instructions:

In each of the four vertical cells, add the following drawings to represent the practical applications of the Word:

- First cell: Draw a teacher, students, and a whiteboard to symbolize teaching.
- <u>Second cell down</u>: Draw an angry face to represent rebuking or confronting someone when necessary.
- Third cell down: Draw a hooked arrow to symbolize correcting someone who is going astray.

<u>Fourth cell down</u>: <u>Draw a cricket team</u> to represent training in righteousness, as it involves practice, discipline, and teamwork.

Give some examples of how this could be practised:

- Teaching: Leading a Bible study group or sharing biblical principles with friends.
- Rebuking: Confronting a fellow believer who is living in sin, in a spirit of love and truth.
- Correcting: Helping someone understand where they may have misunderstood Scripture or strayed from its teachings.
- Training in righteousness: Encouraging habits such as regular prayer, scripture memorization, and serving others.





Drawing Instructions:

From left to right, draw the following:

- o A small person to represent your limited understanding.
- In the middle of the page, draw the Word (Scripture) with a flame on top to symbolize the Holy Spirit's illumination.

<u>To the right</u>, draw a <u>small red dot</u> (representing lack of knowledge), with an arrow pointing to a <u>large morning star</u> on the <u>far right</u> (signifying growth in knowledge and wisdom, moving towards enlightenment).

Reflect on Peter's experience of hearing God's voice affirming Jesus (Mat 17:1-13).



What do the prophets and Jesus on the mountain represent?


Discuss the significance of the Law (Moses), the Prophets (Elijah), and Jesus as the fulfilment of God's Word.



What is the meaning of the "light in a dark place"? What is the dark place, and what is the light?

Dark place: Represents ignorance, doubt, or spiritual darkness.

Light: The truth and clarity brought by Scripture illuminated by the Holy Spirit.











Where do the Scriptures come from?

Highlight that Scriptures are not from human interpretation but inspired by the Holy Spirit (2 Peter 1:20-21).



Do you understand everything in the Scriptures?

Reflect on the humility needed to admit gaps in understanding.



What does God want you to do if you are unsure or don't understand the Scriptures?

Persevere in study, pray for the Holy Spirit's guidance, and seek wisdom.



(Think about incorporating practices such as prayer, meditation on Scripture, and asking God for wisdom.)












Write the label as "Heb 4:12-13 - ACCOUNTABILITY, JUDGEMENT & HEALING"

- o In the <u>middle</u> of the Bible, draw a <u>double-edged sword</u>, symbolizing the Word's "living", "active", and "healing" qualities.
- To the left of the sword, draw a brain to represent "thoughts" and a heart to represent "attitudes".
- To the right of the sword, draw a scale to symbolize "judgment", and a victory cup to represent the "reward" to come.

<u>In the center</u>, add an **eye** to signify the "transparency" of our lives before God.

HEART QUESTIONS:



How would you feel if all your thoughts of the last 24 hours were exposed to the people around you? How many thoughts did you have today that you wish to keep secret?

(Reflect on the fact that nothing is hidden from God, and consider how this awareness can lead to greater accountability and humility.)

Do you think God knows all your thoughts?

(Yes, God knows every thought. This realization should encourage us to be honest with Him and seek His help in changing our hearts.)

Are you willing to give God permission to work in your life, even if it hurts?

(Consider the cost of true spiritual transformation and whether you are open to God's refining work, even when it's uncomfortable.)






Balance

This section emphasizes the need for a balance between life and doctrine, encouraging students to reflect on both their beliefs and how they live them out. The visual of the airplane helps illustrate the importance of balance in maintaining a steady spiritual course.

We need to be balanced to save both ourselves and others.

1Ti 4:16 - LIFE AND DOCTRINE



Drawing Instructions:

- Draw an airplane with two wings and a person in the cockpit, representing you in control of your life.

(Think about practical steps you can take to align your life more closely with sound doctrine. This could involve deeper study, accountability, or making specific lifestyle changes.)





(Reflect on your willingness to trust God's Word, even when it challenges your understanding.)

Obstacle 4: Distortion vs God's will

✓ Drawing Instructions:

Draw Glasses which is based on 2Pet 3:16-18 and represents "Distorted knowledge."

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS:

How do we know if some-one is ignorant?

How do we know if someone is unstable?

What is the consequence of ignorance and instability?

The consequence is spiritual destruction, leading people away from the truth of God's Word.

(Reflect on whether you fully grasp the Scriptures or need more study and guidance.)

Think about teachings such as forgiveness, self-control, and repentance that may be difficult to accept or act on.



So whatever I say is just what the Father has told me to say."

Mat 7:21 "Not everyone who says to me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but only the one who does the will of my Father who is in heaven. 22 Many will say to me on that day, 'Lord, Lord, did we not prophesy in your name and in your name drive out demons and in your name perform many miracles?' 23 Then I will tell them plainly, 'I never knew you. Away from me, you evildoers!'

Act 17:10 As soon as it was night, the brothers sent Paul and Silas away to Berea.
