



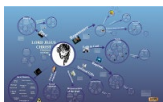

Inability to change sinful behavior



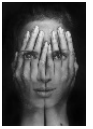

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Do you blame others for your sin?

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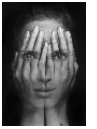
What can you do to take ownership of your sin?

**Act 26:20** *First to those in Damascus, then to those...read all*

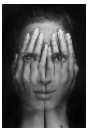
When was a change in their deeds expected? Before they turned to God or after they did so?
