Visualize Faith and Grace

Divide your paper into three horizontal rows.

Draw yourself on each row. You will determine which row represents you the most (Faithless, Selfrighterouness, and Grace). Add a sin container next to you on each level. Fill each container up with the first sin you already committed as well as all the sins are going to likely commit in your life.



Top row: Works/ Faithlessness

Man on the left (you), Draw a sin container. Add an average life expectancy age for the end of your lifetime at the top of the scale. Add lines as your sin accumulated throughout your lifetime to date.

Read Rom 6:23 and Draw a scull (wage of sin), a large rock with the words "Doing Good" written on it, and a man pulling a heavy rock (your attempt to empty the sin container in your life. Draw a skull and a fire at the end of your life.

Middle row: Religious Works

Man on the left (you), Draw a sin container. Add lines as your sin accumulated in your life to date.

Draw a scull which was every religious person's state before salvation. Add a small cross with the year you became saved. Read Gal 3:3 to show religious deeds. After that, you started doing many religious good deeds. Draw fish (sharing your faith), a scroll (for reading your God's Word), David's start (if you are a Jew saved by works), an An-najma (if you are a Muslim saved by works).

Draw a large rock with the words "Religious works" written on it, and a man pulling a heavy rock (your attempt to empty the sin container of your life).

Draw a skull and a fire at the end of your life.

Top row: Grace

Read Eph 2:4-10; 1Co 15:10-11

Man on the left (you), Draw a sin container. Add lines as your sin accumulated in your life to date.

Draw a scull which was every religious person's state before salvation. Add a small cross with the year you became saved.

Read 1Co 1:24; Gal 5:16, 22-25. Draw a wire connected to the cross that is connected right up into heaven (Grace and power of God). Connect a man with a flame to the wire (man walking by faith in the power of the Holy Spirit). The deeds are now words drawn inside hearts such as love, teaching others, giving to the needy, and making disciples.


At the end of the line add a big heart that represents being united with God.
