


False Doctrine about Salvation

MY STORY - BAPTISM

What can one expect when you are on the wrong side of God? Even when we are in a godless state, Jehovah is at work in our lives. We might be separated, but God works for the good of the saved and unsaved.

As a young man in 1983, I was part of the South African police force, stationed at Brixton and living at John Forster Square Police station. The country was in a violent state, exposing us on a daily basis to the worst of humanity, death, gruesome events, brokenness, and much more. The environment took it's toll on us as we worked daily in these conditions. The police employed chaplains to look after the emotional and spiritual welfare of the police, but we never saw them.



During this time, I witnessed how my colleagues committed suicide, abused liquor, and acted violently, all under the direct eye of the religious police chaplains. There was a disconnect between the role of the religious leaders and finding truth and finding God. For many religious leaders, it is just a job, and many are deceived themselves. Yet, there are many religious leaders that does teach the truth but that is hard to determine when you yourself are ignorant. So, I did not understand salvation, what the Bible teaches about salvation, or how to attain salvation. At the birth of my oldest son Peter, my wife and I were traditionally and religiousleaders and my sceptic nature, I no longer trusted the religious leaders. Obviously, the pressure was mounting from our family to "get on with the christening", as most of the arrangements were being made. The baby's christening dress was arranged, a cake was baked and my grandfather of over 80 heart was checked, who would have carried our son into the church.

In search for answers, we studied the bible, but somehow none of the scriptures encouraged us to perform the traditional christening. There was no command in the Bible for the parents to perform a christening and no convincing examples of infant baptism. The only close case was that of the jailer in Act 16:33.

Act 16:33 At that hour of the night, the jailer took Paul and Silas and washed their wounds. Right away he and his whole family were baptized.

It was rather unlikely for infants to be part of this baptism since it was conducted in the middle of the night and children were not explicitly mentioned in this example or anywhere else.

One wonders why there seemed to be an urgency related to the baptism of the jailer and his family. This all does not equate with the modern-day infant sprinkling. It is evident that baptism in the first century was not performed as part of a church ritual and that there was a great urgency around getting baptized. All the first-century baptism examples support this view.

The dilemma grew for us. It became difficult to apply and equate the examples in the Scripture as justification for the sprinkling of our son, Peter. We were confronted with scriptures that point towards adult baptism rather than infant baptism, and the case grew stronger the more time I spend in the scriptures.

Although we were in an ideal situation to seek justification for infant baptism, we took a neutral stance on the matter and sought guidance from the scriptures.









In a final attempt by the family to persuade us to perform infant baptism, they commissioned a professor from the University of Pretoria to meet with us. I had three questions for the learned man:

Is there a scripture that commands parents to christen their infants?

He answered: "there is no command in the scriptures for parents to sprinkle their infants."

According to the professor, it was all about dedicating children to God. But for this, even a simple prayer will do. Baptism was nowhere used in the Scripture for the dedication of children to God. Children are automatically made holy through the faith of one believing partner in a marriage.

1Co 7:14 For the unbelieving husband has been sanctified through his wife, and the unbelieving wife has been sanctified through her believing husband. Otherwise your children would be unclean, but as it is, they are holy.

The second question was: Are there any negative consequences if we don't christen our son?

He answered: "there are no negative consequences according to the scriptures for both the child and the parent if they don't christen their child."

I did not want to perform some religious ritual to please my family unless it was a clear command in the Scripture. What amazed me was that the professor based the argument more on tradition and rituals than on a biblical basis.

My third question was: What happens if I perform infant baptism (sprinkle) on my son?

He answered: "nothing really. it is simply a promise to God that you dedicate you son to him."

There was no further true biblical argument around why we should christen our son. Abraham circumcision does not equate to baptism, and if it was circumcision, it had to be performed within seven days from birth or else the child would be cut off from Israel. Theologians tried in many ways to justify infant baptism, but all the reasons provided was a weak case. Any explanation required a complex and extreme deductive justification to prove the point. The explanations were surely not simple. It is our human nature to justify our current views, to find arguments to explain the desired answer.

So, what is baptism really all about? If we would have asked a Hebrew reader what baptism is all about, what would they answered? Or if we asked the first disciples/ Christians that were baptized by Peter in Acts 2, what would they have said about baptism as a doctrine? Remember they come from a Jewish religious background.

Washing (Baptism) played an important part all over in the Old Testament. The people were instructed to wash (baptize) their clothes, Aaron and his sons were commanded to wash their hands and feet before entering the Tent of Meeting or else









they would die. Washing was a serious act of worship and performed many times in all kinds of ways and in many situations. Special baths were made for this ritual, and these huge baths are the very place where the first baptisms were performed in Acts 2 by Paul.

The word washing and baptism is synonym between the Old Testament and the New Testament. Baptism is similar to the washing of the Old Testament, a spiritual cleansing act before God.

Peter explain that it is not a physical act but baptism equates to a prayer for salvation.

1Pe 3:20 who disobeyed long ago when God waited patiently in the days of Noah while the ark was being built. In it only a few people, eight in all, were saved through water, 21 and this water symbolizes baptism that now saves you also—not the removal of dirt from the body but the pledge of a good conscience toward God. It saves you by the resurrection of Jesus Christ,

The powerful washing is, therefore still used in the New Testament as the cleansing way from the former way of life. Maybe now it makes sense why the jailer was so urgent with the cleansing process.

If you read carefully, you will find in most baptism examples in the New Testament there is a sense of urgency involved. All baptisms are performed on the spot with not a single example of an organized church meeting where baptisms are to be performed. Have a look at the urgency of the examples below:

The first sermon and baptisms in Acts

Act 2:37 When the people heard this, they were cut to the heart and said to Peter and the other apostles, "Brothers, what shall we do?" 38 Peter replied, "Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. And you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. 39 The promise is for you and your children and for all who are far off—for all whom the Lord our God will call." 40 With many other words he warned them; and he pleaded with them, "Save yourselves from this corrupt generation." 41 Those who accepted his message were baptized, and about three thousand were added to their number that day.

The Ethiopian eunuch on the road

Act 8:36 As they traveled along the road, they came to some water and the eunuch said, "Look, here is water. Why shouldn't I be baptized?" 37 [Philip said, "If you believe with all your heart, you may." The eunuch answered, "I believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God."] 38 And he gave orders to stop the chariot. Then both Philip and the eunuch went down into the water and Philip baptized him. 39 When they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord suddenly took Philip away, and the eunuch did not see him again, but went on his way rejoicing.

Sauls conversion in the desert









Act 9:17 Then Ananias went to the house and entered it. Placing his hands on Saul, he said, "Brother Saul, the Lord—Jesus, who appeared to you on the road as you were coming here—has sent me so that you may see again and be filled with the Holy Spirit." 18 Immediately, something like scales fell from Saul's eyes, and he could see again. He got up and was baptized, 19 and after taking some food, he regained his strength. Saul spent several days with the disciples in Damascus.

First Gentile baptisms

Act 10:47 "Can anyone keep these people from being baptized with water? They have received the Holy Spirit just as we have." 48 So he ordered that they be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. Then they asked Peter to stay with them for a few days.

Conversion of Lydia

Act 16:15 When she and the members of her household were baptized, she invited us to her home. "If you consider me a believer in the Lord," she said, "come and stay at my house." And she persuaded us.

The urgency of baptism revolves around the understanding that we somehow need Jesus Christ the Son of the Living God and the only way of becoming part of this promise of God is through the baptism of ceremonial washing. That is why Peter in Acts 2 warns the people to get baptized. Paul explains our participation in baptism clearly in Romans 6.

Rom 6:4 We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life. 5 If we have been united with him like this in his death, we will certainly also be united with him in his resurrection. 6 For we know that our old self was crucified with him so that the body of sin might be done away with, that we should no longer be slaves to sin—7 because anyone who has died has been freed from sin. 8 Now if we died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. 9 For we know that since Christ was raised from the dead, he cannot die again; death no longer has mastery over him. 10 The death he died, he died to sin once for all; but the life he lives, he lives to God. 11 In the same way, count yourselves dead to sin but alive to God in Christ Jesus.

Faith is the foundation for salvation and a prerequisite for baptism.

Col 2:12 having been buried with him in baptism and raised with him through your faith in the power of God, who raised him from the dead.

Baptism is probably the easiest biblical topic to study because all you have to do is search "baptism" with an electronic bible tool and then go through the scriptures.

Mar **16:16** *Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved, but whoever*









does not believe will be condemned.

Jesus says believe and be baptized.

Mat 28:19 Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit,

The case grows, and one can continue to "churn out scriptures". The point is maybe around personal urgency. If there is no urgency, then baptism remains a dogmatic argument. What are the reasons why we argue against adult baptism? My advice is to put aside the religious past and follow the biblical model for salvation and cleansing. We should be careful not to hold onto false religion and church tradition.

For our firstborn son, Peter, the christening was off. We now had to break the news to our parents and family. It did not go well. There was big trouble in our family. All the arrangements were canceled. Now we had to face a new problem.

Both my wife and I were christened as infant with no recollection of the event. We appreciate the intention of our parents, but the ceremony do not align with scriptures or God's commands. Not only did we cancel our son, Peter's infant christening, but we informed our family that we, my wife and I, will be baptized instead. Our family's perception was that we rejected our upbringing and religious traditions. This is not the case because we learned a lot from our parents and our tradition. But that was hard for them to see at the time. They did not share or understand our journey. Ultimately, we are accountable to God and need to follow his commands and decrees and not the tradition of men.

Mar 7:13 Thus you nullify the word of God by your tradition that you have handed down. And you do many things like that."

I am from a violent background and for me baptism was the point where I laid down my life and clothed myself with Christ. That is where all my past and future sins got wiped out by the power of Jesus Blood. Our baptism was a momentous moment in our lives. We had a clear understanding of why we were baptized and what saved us. We did not work for this but participated in God's command.

We were baptized in some-one's back pool and I had the honor to baptized my wife. It was the point of adoption into God's family and we walked away with a clear conscious through Christ.

1Pe 3:20 to those who were disobedient long ago when God waited patiently in the days of Noah while the ark was being built. In it only a few people, eight in all, were saved through water, 21 and this water symbolizes baptism that now saves you also--not the removal of dirt from the body but the pledge of a clear conscience toward God. It saves you by the resurrection of Jesus Christ, 22 who has gone into heaven and is at God's right hand--with angels, authorities and powers in submission to him.









My mother in law backed christening cake for Peter's had to be eaten. Ironically, we celebrated our baptism by eating the christening cake. We did not have a smooth transition into our new Christian life with our parents and family.

Baptism has always been a controversial issue, even from the time of Jesus. By rejecting baptism, we reject God's salvation plan for your life. Even the Pharisees refused to accept a baptism which is similar to most biblical teachers today:

Luk 7:30 But the Pharisees and experts in the law rejected God's purpose for themselves, because they had not been baptized by John.

The bible is filled with scriptures that clarify baptism. It would be better to build you your conviction on your own bible study. Take some time out and study the scriptures in their biblical context.

MEMORY VERSE

Don't try and learn all the memory verses at once but only select one or two verses each week. Go at a pace that doesn't add too much pressure on yourself and others. You will find new meaning to the scriptures you memorize.

Rom 6:3 Or don't you know that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? 4 We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life. 1Pe 3:20 who disobeyed long ago when God waited patiently in the days of Noah while the ark was being built. In it only a few people, eight in all, were saved through water, 21 and this water symbolizes baptism that now saves you also—not the removal of dirt from the body but the pledge of a good conscience toward God. It saves you by the resurrection of Jesus Christ,

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Act 2:36 "Therefore let all Israel be assured of this: God has made this Jesus, whom you crucified, both Lord and Messiah." Act 2:37 When the people heard this, they were cut to the heart and said to Peter and the other apostles, "Brothers, what shall we do?" Act 2:38 Peter replied, "Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. And you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit.
