














### **PUNISHMENT**



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Before we begin it is important to emphasize that gaining scriptural knowledge in itself, though important, is not enough to change character. Putting biblical knowledge into practice is the key, that teaches truth and the power of God which in turn changes hearts and lives. (John 8:31-32). The study is structured in a way that you will write out the scriptures yourselves for the purposes of deeper reflection. Here are some key points on how to get the most out of the booklet:

- Read the scriptures before answering the questions (really important)!
   In this way you will learn to know the word of God.
- o Always find the answer from the Bible. Although you might think you know the answer, first find the answer in the Bible.
- o Complete all the answers on the booklet.
- o Be very honest with yourself, even if it hurts.
- o Always have a memory verse you are working on.
- o It is a good idea to share what you are learning with a friend.

## **MEMORY VERSE**



Don't try and learn all the memory verses at once but only select one or two verses each week. Go at a pace that doesn't add too much pressure on yourself and others. You will find new meaning to the scriptures you memorize.

Luk 12:4 "I tell you, my friends, do not be afraid of those who kill the body and after that can do no more. 5 But I will show you whom you should fear: Fear him who, after your body has been killed, has authority to throw you into hell. Yes, I tell you, fear him. 6 Are not five sparrows sold for two pennies? Yet not one of them is forgotten by God. 7 Indeed, the very hairs of your head are all numbered. Don't be afraid: vou are worth more than many sparrows.

Heb 10:26 If we deliberately keep on sinning after we have received the knowledge of the truth, no sacrifice for sins is left, Heb 10:27 but only a fearful expectation of judgment and of raging fire that will consume the enemies of God. 28 Anyone who rejected the law of Moses died without mercy on the testimony of two or three witnesses. 29 How much more severely do you think a man deserves to be punished who has trampled the Son of God under foot, who has treated as an unholy thing the blood of the covenant that sanctified him, and who has insulted the Spirit of grace?



## **ANNEXURE**

### **Biblical Punishment Concepts**

New Testament (Greek) Terms for Hell and Punishment

#### 1. Gehenna (γέεννα)

- **Meaning**: Derived from the Hebrew "Valley of Hinnom," where child sacrifices were made, Gehenna became a symbol of the final place of punishment for the wicked. It is often translated as "hell."
- **Example**: "And if your eye causes you to sin, tear it out. It is better for you to enter the kingdom of God with one eye than with two eyes to be thrown into hell [Gehenna]." (Mark 9:47, ESV)
- Notable Passages: Matthew 5:22, 10:28; Mark 9:43, 9:45

#### 2. Hades (ἄδης)

- **Meaning**: The Greek equivalent of *Sheol*, referring to the place of the dead. While it often denotes the general realm of the dead, in certain New Testament passages, it refers to a place of punishment for the wicked.
- **Example**: "And in Hades, being in torment, he lifted up his eyes and saw Abraham far off and Lazarus at his side." (Luke 16:23, ESV)
- Notable Passages: Luke 16:23; Matthew 16:18; Revelation 1:18, 20:13-14

#### 3. Tartarus (ταρταρόω)

- **Meaning**: Used once in the New Testament, *Tartarus* refers to the deepest part of the underworld where fallen angels are confined. It is a place of extreme punishment.
- **Example**: "For if God did not spare angels when they sinned, but cast them into hell [Tartarus] and committed them to chains of gloomy darkness to be kept until the judgment..." (2 Peter 2:4, ESV)

#### 4. Aiónios Púr (αίώνιος πῦρ) — "Eternal Fire"

- **Meaning**: This term refers to unending divine fire, symbolizing eternal punishment for the wicked, including the devil and his angels.
- **Example**: "Then he will say to those on his left, 'Depart from me, you cursed, into the eternal fire [aiónios púr] prepared for the devil and his angels." (Matthew 25:41, ESV)
- Notable Passages: Matthew 25:41, Jude 1:7

#### 5. Kolasis Aiónios (κόλασις αίώνιος) — "Eternal Punishment"

 Meaning: This phrase refers to eternal punishment, contrasting the eternal life given to the righteous. It underscores the never-ending nature of divine judgment.

• **Example**: "And these will go away into eternal punishment [kolasis aiónios], but the righteous into eternal life." (Matthew 25:46, ESV)

#### 6. Limnē Pyrós (λίμνη πυρός) — "Lake of Fire"

- **Meaning**: Describes the final destination for the devil, the beast, the false prophet, and all the wicked after judgment. The term signifies ultimate, eternal punishment.
- **Example**: "And the devil who had deceived them was thrown into the lake of fire and sulfur where the beast and the false prophet were, and they will be tormented day and night forever and ever." (Revelation 20:10, ESV)
- Notable Passages: Revelation 19:20, 20:10, 20:14-15, 21:8

#### 7. The Worm That Does Not Die (ὁ σκώληξ αὐτῶν ού τελευτᾳ)

- Meaning: This phrase refers to the unending internal torment experienced in hell. The Greek term σκώληξ (skōlēx) means "worm," and the phrase οὐ τελευτῷ (ou teleutá) means "does not die" or "does not come to an end." Together, they form a picture of eternal suffering. The imagery is drawn from Isaiah 66:24, where the worm signifies ongoing decay and torment for the rebellious. The phrase is paired with the image of unquenchable fire, symbolizing external and internal torment.
- Example: "Where their worm does not die and the fire is not quenched." (Mark 9:48, ESV)
- Notable Passages: Mark 9:43-48 (quoting Isaiah 66:24)
  - Greek Text: "ὅπου ὁ σκώληξ αὐτῶν οὐ τελευτᾳ καὶ τὸ πῦρ οὐ σβέννυται" (Hopou ho skōlēx autōn ou teleutá kai to púr ou sbénnutai.)
  - Isaiah 66:24 (LXX): "καὶ ἰδοῦσι τὰ κῶλα τῶν ἀνδρῶν τῶν παραβεβηκότων εἰς ἐμέ· ὁ γὰρ σκώληξ αὐτῶν οὐ τελευτήσει καὶ τὸ πῦρ αὐτῶν οὐ σβεσθήσεται" (kai idousin ta kōla tōn andrōn tōn parabeékontōn eis eme· ho gar skōlēx autōn ou teleutései kai to púr autōn ou sbesésetai.)
  - Translation: "And they shall go out and look on the dead bodies of the men who have rebelled against me. For their worm shall not die, their fire shall not be quenched, and they shall be an abhorrence to all flesh."
